Lamb ro Manufa Morris (nufacturing Machinery Bids eported that two (2) bids had been submitted for the replacement lathes for the acturing Program. Haas Factory Outlet's bid was \$54,721 and The Robert E Company's bid was \$88,000. The bid was for two (2) lathes. Lamb asked a for his input.
\rightarrow	reported that he was happy with the Haas quote and noted his reasons why: The Haas machinery is compatible with the other, older Haas equipment the program is using.
\rightarrow	The programming method that the Haas lathes use is of great help to students regarding the complex math needed to program these machines. This method is the greatest training device that he has seen. The Haas lathes have "intuitive programming", i.e. "G-Code"; the machine "traces" manual movements and puts the movements into code. Haas's equipment is the only one that provides this feature.
\rightarrow	Haas lathes are used at Hudson Valley Community College, RPI, WPI and throughout the northeast at tech centers and higher education institutes. Having experience with Haas machinery thereby provides an excellent background for CDC students.
\rightarrow	Haas's provides outstanding customer service and understands and accommodates their customer's needs.
purchas	oup discussed Gabrus' points, machine delivery, and payment. Lamb noted the se policy has been followed. Gabrus thanked the committee for their tanding of student needs and the Board's support.
	moved and DeLucia seconded a motion to recommend to the full Board at bruary 12 th RGB Meeting the purchase of the two lathes from Haas. All were r.
Oyama	Idcare Lease noted that Childcare's three-year lease ends this June. The presented draft sexactly the same as the prior lease with the exception of the date change to

reflect the upcoming three-year period and the lease amount. Insurance requirements are adequate and will remain the same.

Lamb inquired as to how the arrangement was working. Oyama responded very well and that it was very helpful for the staff and students.

It was noted that the childcare business is private: it provides a lab for the Human Services program in return for the space. Childcare slots are open to any one, not only SVSU or CDC.

The committee discussed the lease payment amount; should it stay at \$500, increase, and if increased, what should be the payment structure? The prior lease amount increased incrementally annually; 2005 was \$200, 2006 was \$300, and 2007 was \$500. Consensus was that the lease should increase incrementally; Year 1 (2008) payment to be \$700, Year 2 (2009) to be \$800 and Year 3 (2010) to be \$1000.

DeLucia moved and Kinney seconded a motion to recommend to the RGB Board that the Childcare lease be renewed with an incremental payment increase schedule of \$700 (2008), \$800 (2009) and \$1,000 (2010). All were in favor.
