Use VSBA for assistance and get MH's 22 input; 23 JL noted regs are in handbook; as of October, no cell phones may be out and visible • 24 during school day classes; rollout planned at MAU/SWT in October of cell phone pouch 25 use; shouldn't leave this issue for individual teachers to decide and police; if phone is off 26 and concealed, that's not a violation; the pouch is a convenience; policy directs the 27 administrator regs for action/discipline to support administrators; policy must be fair and 28 equitable to address all needs 29 LJ outside of present policy, cannot support; last paragraph needs language change; • what do we do about our other sending schools? 30 **JO**-doesn't matter what other schools do, this would be OUR policy; what is this pouch; 31 • need more info; teens are built to break rules, so policy should be strong and detailed; 32 can students use on personal time?
